The participation of FAWE Regional Secretariat as trainers during the workshop capacitated FAWEESWA with skills and knowledge in Gender-Responsive Pedagogy training.

33 people (30 Teachers and 3 Guidance Officers) were equipped with knowledge of GRP and were able to see the need to change their teaching and classroom management practices.

FAWEESWA has detailed work plans for each of the 15 schools. The plans will help FAWEESWA and the Guidance Officers to monitor the trained teachers.
